

## CA LCC draft strategic plan

### Mission

The California Landscape Conservation Cooperative (CA LCC) is a partnership created to inform and promote integrated science, natural resource management and conservation to address impacts of climate change and other stressors within and across ecosystems.

### Vision

*A lasting collaborative partnership of resource managers and scientists sustaining California's biological diversity and healthy ecosystems through the application of relevant science to landscape management decisions.*

The CA LCC's overall goal is ***to develop a conservation community that will help sustain ecosystem processes required for healthy wildlife and plant populations and natural communities that are resilient and adaptable in the face of environmental change and other stressors.***

Two roles the CA LCC has defined to meet the needs of our partners in natural resource management over the next five years are to:

1. Foster collaboration and integration of science and management to improve decision making and conservation outcomes within the context of climate change and other stressors.
2. Improve adaptation and resilience within the CA LCC by providing and facilitating critical science and technical support in the areas of wildfire risk, coastal ecosystem resilience, and water availability.

### Five-Year Strategic Plan

**Objective 1. Improve resource manager access to and use of relevant science to benefit decision-making and conservation outcomes at a landscape scale.**

**Objective 2. Launch three thematic focal areas, wildfire, coastal ecosystem and water, through which the CA LCC will work with conservation partners to build adaptation capacity and resilience.**

**Objective 3. Improve and expand the formative impacts and relevance of the CA LCC for building lasting capacity to sustain California's biodiversity and ecosystems.**
